Steve Cass, Paderewski Festival Board Member Paso Pops 2017

One of the most memorable local events in 2016 was the inaugural Paso Pops concert & fireworks extravaganza organized by the Paderewski Festival Board of Directors. The event attracted over 4,200 attendees, greatly exceeding even the most optimistic projections for attendance. Paderewski Board Member Steve Cass continues as a leading organizer and advocate for Paso Pops. Steve announced that the 2nd annual event will be held on Saturday, July 1, at the Paso Robles Horse Park.



Steve Cass is well known in the Paso Robles community as the co-founder of Cass Vineyards & Winery as well as numerous civic activities. Steve moved to Paso Robles with his wife Alice after a highly successful career at Charles Schwab. They planted a 145 acre vineyard east of Paso and added a successful winery and tasting room with the help of his partner Ted Plemons that opened in 2005.

The Paderewski Festival concert series was originally organized in 1993 to honor the legacy of piano virtuoso Ignacy Jan Paderewski,but it was suspended after the major earthquake in 2003. The festival was re-launched in 2006 by Steve, the USC Polish Music Center, and Joel Peterson, grandson of the Paderewski Festival's founder Virginia Peterson. The unique Paso Pops event was added last year to the festival's expanding list of activities to promote music appreciation and education.

While the first Paso Pops concert wildly exceeded expectations on attendance, organizers were not fully prepared to handle the enormous crowd. So much effort this year is being put into addressing prior entry, parking, food and beverage service issues. There will be over 40 wineries serving fine wine. Firestone is now a major sponsor and will keep the beer flowing. In addition to more food trucks and food, Allegretto is offering pre-orders of food to ensure availability and to speed service. The great symphony, howitzers, and MC Casey Biggs will all be back.
