Angelica Fortin, Librarian Paso Library & Foundation

Angelica Fortin does not look like the old, bespectacled librarian that is often portrayed on television. Angelica is a young, vivacious new administrator of the Paso Robles Library. She clearly has a vision and a passion for her work. She is expected to lead Paso Robles Library into the Digital Age and meet the unique information needs of our community according to Julie Dahlen, the director of Recreation & Library Services.

Angelica grew up in San Diego and attended San Jose State and San Diego State universities. She took the position in Paso Robles after serving 10 years with the San Diego County Library as a Principal Librarian overseeing program services for 33 branches, a system-wide volunteer program, staff training, and bookmobile services. She may be the only librarian in the country to officiate roller derby where she was known as the "Hellion Librarian".



Angelica started her presentation by outlining four reasons why libraries are important: 1) <u>Democracy</u> - libraries educate people by providing access to credible government information and help filter out "fake news", 2) <u>Life-Long Learning</u> - reading to pre-school children can help close the achievement gap due to unequal summer learning opportunities and reading can help retirees avoid deteriorating mental health, 3) <u>Public Safety</u> - over half of young adults with criminal records or substance abuse problems also have reading deficiencies, 4) <u>Economic Development</u> - property owners near libraries have increased property values in part from "halo spending" by those using libraries and libraries provide workforce development opportunities that improve job skills.

The Paso Library is a well used resource with 24,000 card holders and over 500 visitors per day. There have been almost 11,000 attendees to various programs hosted by the library and 110 volunteers supporting its activities. Providing digital resources such as WiFi, computer terminals and on-line programming to users is a growing priority for our library.
