John Donovan Abraham Lincoln in His Own Words

Club Members celebrated the Presidents' Day holiday early by listening to the immortal words of Abraham Lincoln delivered by local Rotarian John Donovan. Wearing a dark beard and iconic stovepipe hat, the 6' 8" Donovan looked every bit as imposing as Lincoln was in his day.



Donovan noted that this February 12 would have been President Lincoln's 208th birthday. He was born in 1809 to Thomas and Nancy Hanks Lincoln in a one-room log cabin on the Sinking Spring Farm. His mother died in 1818 and his father married a widow, Sarah "Sally" Bush Johnston. Of note, Lincoln had no relationship with his father but was very close to his step mother. As a young man, he unsuccessfully tried several occupations, and then became a lawyer in

1836. Lincoln married Mary Todd from a wealthy slave owning family in 1842. They had four sons and only one, Robert, survived to adulthood.

Lincoln was elected to the IL State legislature in 1834 as a member of the Whig Party. In 1846, he was elected to the U.S. House. After one term, Lincoln returned to practice law in Springfield. There he helped form the antislavery Republican Party. He ran for Senate against Stephen Douglas and their debates on slavery are considered the most famous in U.S. history. While he lost the Senate race, Lincoln went on to defeat Douglas in the presidential race of 1860 becoming the 16th president. While he won on an antislavery platform, his primary focus was to save the Union during the Civil War. After 5 years and 615,000 casualties, the war finally ended in 1865. Lincoln's leadership in bringing the broken country back together make him one of our nation's greatest presidents.

In real life, John Donovan is a State Farm insurance agent in Atascadero. He graduated from Marist College in Poughkeepsie, NY, with a degree in Communications. He is a member of the Atascadero Rotary Club (President, 2012-13) and the Atascadero Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. He has been a resident of the Central Coast since 1990. He has five daughters and lives in Templeton.
