In this role, he is responsible for developing and implementing long range strategic and fiscal plans as well as air quality policies and regulations adopted by the APCD Board of Directors. The mission of the APCD is to realize and preserve clean air for all, promote community & individual responsibility for air quality, and provide quality & cost-effective service.



field for over 30 years and has expertise in many subject areas including air monitoring, air quality planning, land use planning, health effects of air pollution, climate change science and solutions. He has degrees from UC Irvine and the University of Montana in botany & biology.

Larry has worked in the air quality management

Larry's recent focus has been on advocating changes in our land use development plans to reduce pollution and greenhouse gases. Since autos

contribute over half of the air pollution in the county, reducing their use and increasing the use of alternatives like public transit, biking and walking is a priority. In addition to air pollution, Larry has been very involved in climate change issues at the local, regional and statewide level and has served on a variety of committees and task forces dealing with climate change mitigation.

Larry noted that in years past, air quality in the county exceeded standards for lead, carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, ozone, & particulate matter. However, advancements in emission controls on vehicles and stationary pollution sources have led to significant improvements in our air quality. As a result, the county now meets most of these standards.

One of the most contentious issues facing the APCD is the Oceano Dunes dust mitigation plan needed to achieve compliance with the APCD Rule 1001. State Parks released a draft EIR for their 5-year mitigation plan in August 2016 that is currently under review by the APCD.
