Chief Robert Burton, Police Chief for the City of Paso Robles

The Paso Robles Police Department is facing new challenges as a result of popular technologies such as smart phones and social media capabilities that can spread information instantaneously around the world. Police Chief Robert Burton believes that these new technologies along with a long-standing "racial divide" have led to increased tensions between police and local communities in some parts of the country. While this has not been a significant issue in Paso Robles, our local law enforcement organizations are taking steps to ensure that their

relationships within our community remain positive.

Burton (left) grew up in San Luis Obispo and graduated from SLO High School and Cal Poly. He began his career working in Fresno, but yearned to get back to the Central Coast. That opportunity came by choosing a new career path in law enforcement as a correctional officer with the SLO County Sheriff's Department. In 1996, he joined the Paso Robles

Police Department where he began a steady assent through the ranks culminating in his appointment as police chief in 2013.

Chief Burton is using the six "pillars" from the *President's Task* Force on 21st Century Policing report to guide their efforts to enhance community relations. They include (1) building trust & legitimacy in the community, (2) improving policy & oversight, (3) addressing technology & social media in a responsible way, (4) building community policing to "co-produce" public safety, (5) enhancing training & education, and (6) ensuring officer wellness & safety. Burton noted

one additional element to success is hiring good people including locals who know the community.

Police Lieutenant Ty Lewis (right) provided members an update on new body cameras that will be added to existing car video equipment to provide another layer of transparency and accountability for local police. Lt. Lewis quipped "(body) cameras will save more bacon than fry".
