PRHS Principal Eric Martinez With Crimson Advisor Jeff Mount & Student Staff

The *Crimson* news magazine is a great example of how Paso Robles High School is living up to its belief that “every student will have success” according to Principal Eric Martinez. Martinez was proud to bring members of the *Crimson* staff to share their experiences and achievements with lunch meeting attendees.



Martinez (*left*) was appointed PRHS principal in May 2016. He previously served as vice principal at his alma mater, Bullard High School in Fresno, and has 17 years of experience serving as a classroom teacher, school administrator, curriculum & athletic coach. He graduated from UCSB and completed his teaching credential and masters degree at CSU Fresno. He lives in Paso Robles with his wife Eliana.

Principal Martinez quickly introduced *Crimson* faculty advisor Jeff Mount and six members of the *Crimson* student staff (*see photo on page 3*) After hearing Rotarians cite the Four-Way Test, Jeff noted that “we are in the same business - is it the truth and is it fair to all concerned”. He postulated that the students he brought with him are “future Rotarians” as their mission is “to get it right, to love our work and community”. This was clearly evident as various members of the staff, including co-editors-in-chief Sadie Mae Mace and Valeria Cisneros, spoke passionately about their work in managing & delivering information, fact finding & writing, and photography.

The *Crimson* news magazine has a total staff of 27 students with very impressive and professional products. The *Crimson* not only includes a traditional print edition, but a web-based version along with Facebook and Instagram feeds. Student accomplishments include 2 top-ten awards for their website and newsprint magazine at the 2016 Nationals in Indianapolis as well as 7 individual awards. The experience at Nationals was tremendous and they plan to attend the 2017 event in Seattle.

Mount asked Rotarians to consider advertising in the *Crimson* with “the cheapest rates in town” to help defray their operating costs.
