
Memorial Day Program-The Robert Rader Story Told by John Hamon, Frank Mecham and Don Rader

This year's Memorial Day program commemorated the life and heroics of

Staff Sergeant Robert Rader, one of the legendary "Band of Brothers" who fought in some of the most epic battles of World War II. Sergeant Rader was a non-commissioned officer with Easy Company, 2nd Battalion, 506th Parachute Infantry Regiment, in the 101st Airborne Division of the United States Army.

John Hamon kicked off the program by talking about the dwindling

number of survivors from our "Greatest Generation" of WWII Frank Meecham (right) veterans who sacrificed so much to ensure the freedom and liberty of



Americans and people around the world. The program was about an individual who didn't die in WWII, but changed the lives of many after returning from war to become a local high school teacher and coach.

but was dishonorably discharged for being too young to serve. After graduating from high school in 1942, he enlisted in the Army as a paratrooper. Rader made his first combat jump into Normandy on D-Day. He also participated in the Operation Market Garden in the Netherlands and in the Battle of the Bulge in Bastogne. Rader fought with his unit until the end of the war and was awarded 2 Bronze Stars for his actions.

After the war, Rader obtained his college degree and became a teacher and coach at PRHS for more than 30 years. He met his wife Lucille in CA and they were married in 1953. He was known as a "nononsense" educator, tough but fair. Robert Rader died on April 7, 1997. A few years later, Paso Robles had the 13th Street bridge over the Salinas River renamed the Robert J. Rader Memorial Bridge in Rader's honor.
