The current marketing campaign identifies "SLO" as a place to enjoy a slower pace of life and do things that matter most. Chuck showed members a recently created video that won a "Poppy Award" for the best digital marketing campaign. It is excellent at capturing the region's laid back lifestyle and beautiful scenery.

In addition to gathering marketing research and analysis such as a new economic impact study, Chuck spends a great deal of time courting airlines to open new routes to connect SLO to places like Seattle via Alaska Airlines or Denver via United Airlines. 
