Gary Barker Pastor, Grace Baptist Church

When club member Gary Barker showed up at our meeting last Thursday with a large sword and spear, some may have wondered why. But Gary brought these tribal weapons along with a great array of photographs to discuss the adventures he and his wife, Mariann, experienced during their time as missionaries in Zambia. Gary and Mariann recently returned from Zambia and settled in Paso Robles where Gary is pastor of the Grace Baptist Church.

At a young age, Gary wanted to be a coach, but eventually found his calling as a minister. He attended divinity school and became pastor of the Grace Baptist Church in Paso Robles for 15 years before moving to Pleasanton, CA, to serve as pastor of the historic Amador Valley Baptist Church for another 16 years. At the age of 57, when many are contemplating retirement plans, Gary and



Mariann announced they were heading to Africa to do missionary work.

Gary began his presentation by providing some background information on Zambia, a land-locked country in the center of southern Africa. Zambia has a population of 15 million people and 60% are children. It is a very poor country where the average income is \$60/month and even a wealthy individual might make only \$500/month. The main industries are copper mining and agriculture. Mortality rates among children are 10% and the average life expectancy is only 36 years. So the Barker's arrival in Zambia was needed and welcomed by locals.

One of the Barker's most visible achievements during their time in Zambia was the construction of the Grace Baptist Church of Showgrounds. It was constructed of mud bricks and completed in 2015. They also started a Baptist Bible College to enable students to study theology at a very low cost. The Barker's time in Zambia was very fulfilling spiritually and educationally as they experienced the wonderful diversity of plants, animals and people in the region. Gary left the church in the good hands of Pastor Mulimba when they returned to the U.S.
