The Institute served as an excellent backdrop for the presentation on Skills USA, a partnership of students, teachers, industry and the community dedicated to ensuring America has the skilled workforce it needs for our 21st century economy. This will be the 50th year of Paso Robles participation in Skills USA that originated 54 years ago in Kentucky.



Randy Canaday leads PRHS in developing the large cadre of students who participate at the local, state, national and even international level in Skills USA competitions. Randy is very proud of the 63 students that have qualified this year for the state competition and he anticipates that many of these will qualify for the Nationals held in Louisville, KY.

The success enjoyed by our local students is not surprising given Randy's no-nonsense approach to preparing students. Randy began coaching students

in 1991. Prior to teaching, he owned an electrical contracting business that provided him perspective on what business owners are looking for in new employees. He noted that in the old days, companies were just looking for employees with the right technical skills. But times have changed. Today, employers are equally concerned that job candidates show up on time, stay past lunch, and come back the next day. They need to know not only how to read a tape measure correctly, but also pass a drug test. So Skills USA provides a holistic program to teach technical, communication, social, and ethics skills. Randy places great emphasis on providing students with the opportunity to learn planning, organization, decision-making, teamwork and leadership skills that are coveted by employers. Randy introduced two students, Mason Steiner and Madison Harris, who have won numerous gold medals at state competitions and exemplify many of the the terrific attributes that Skills USA develops.
