One of these is Dr. Jim Brescia, who serves as SLO County Superintendent of Schools and has been a member of Rotary for 20 years. As Jim wrote in the Annual Education Report for 2017-18: "The SLO County Office of Education has the opportunity to lead our local educational community in educating our future citizenry. We believe that education is a social justice issue, ensures our democracy, and is a fundamental right for everyone. Our office promotes student success by supporting the work of local school districts, delivering specialized student services and providing county-wide leadership and advocacy for the needs of all children."

Jim was born in Lynwood and raised in the Bay Area. James received his undergraduate degree from UC San Diego, his doctorate from UC Santa Barbara and an additional graduate degree from Cal State Dominguez Hills. Jim has a tremendous breadth of experience as a elementary, middle & high school principal, migrant education program specialist, superintendent, chief human resources officer, chief business official and development director. He now leads an organization with 230 employees and a budget of \$41 M.

Jim has many interests and skills. He is a talented singer and has appeared on stage for musicals at Wine Country Theatre. He is a strong proponent of the recent efforts to expand visual & performing arts curriculums for all students in the county. He is also passionate about Rancho El Chorro, a Rotary sponsored outdoor school and nature preserve that has served over 250,000 children from SLO County and other schools. This project has attracted interest and sponsorship from eleven Rotary clubs including the international club in Nayarit, Mexico. Our \$5,000 donation to Rancho El Chorro this week will help fund two new yurts, a tent-like structure used to shelter students.

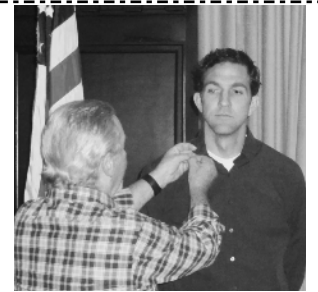
