# **Bill O'Neil** First Four Decades of Space Exploration at JPL

Taking Rotary a few steps back into space exploration history, Bill O'Neil, retired Jet Propulsion Laboratory engineer and program manager, gave Rotarians a brief history of deep space programs. Beginning in 1962,

the Mariner 2 was the first spacecraft to encounter another planet. The successful launch by an Atlas-Agena rocket performed a flyby of Venus using a challenging slow down retrograde path. This was the first time such a path had been used to a planet inside the Earth orbit. In 1964. Mariner 4 was launched to perform a flyby of Mars and to take photos that showed a cratered and dead surface, finally ending the debate of life on Mars.



With more history of the Mariner

exploration series, O'Neil impressed with his knowledge of trajectories and navigation of the various spacecraft as they traversed the great distances to intercept the planets of the Solar System. He showed that timing is everything, planning the launch date optimally to depart Earth tangentally and to meet its destination tangentally where it would be in months or years in the future. O'Neil followed up with Viking, Voyager, and Galileo missions using gravity assist from the planets, slingshot maneuvers, and always with an eye on time. As the Program Manager for Galileo spacecraft, O'Neil spoke of the orbital mission and the first probe into the atmosphere. He also spoke with pride about "beating the Russians", the value of the science, and working the government budget system.

Bill O'Neil is an expert in trajectory design and interplanetary navigation, received NASA's highest award (Distinguished Service Medal), honorary Doctorates from University of Padua and Purdue University, and NASA leadership medals. He and his wife of 60 years, Diane, reside in Atascadero.
