Greg McGill, Board Member Honor Flight Central Coast

Greg McGill is very passionate about helping veterans. He actualizes his passion through Honor Flight, a non-profit group that takes veterans *at no cost* to visit their war memorials in Washington, DC. Greg observes that "if the Government builds memorials, all vets should get to visit and experience them." Their priority are the most senior veterans. With only 700 World War II veterans still living, they are working hard to arrange



Honor Flights for this rapidly dwindling group and are now offering trips to Korean War veterans and planning for Vietnam veterans. There are currently 134 Honor Flight "hubs" spanning 42 states.

John Hamon introduced Greg and two special guests, Ed Monteath and Don Keefer, who have both participated in Honor Flights. John provided some fascinating history on Ed and Don. Ed joined the Navy in 1940 and flew dive bombers in the Pacific Theater in

WWII. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal for his valor. Army Private Don Keefer served in the 5th Infantry in Europe and was awarded a Bronze Star for his heroic actions successfully defending against an overwhelming force of attacking Germans shortly before the end of the war in August, 1945. John also recognized another Honor Flight participant, Don Jacobs, who was unable to attend lunch. Don had previously shared that "the greatest honor of his life" was laying a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier during his Honor Flight.

Greg grew up in SLO County and graduated from Templeton High School. He moved to Bakerfield to attend college and joined the Kern County Fire Department after graduation. He got involved with Honor Flight in Kern County in 2012. He was so moved by the experience that he felt compelled to start an Honor Flight hub in the Central Coast. They have completed 8 flights to date involving 250 veterans. The trips are truly meaningful for both the veterans and the "Guardians" who serve as escorts to help assist the veterans and make the travel more enjoyable.
