Scott Leckman Governor-Elect - District 5249

Scott Leckman is the Governor-Elect for a Rotary District in Utah. Scott came to share his experiences in participating directly in numerous Rotary International grant projects in India. Scott was introduced by Curt Dubost who operates Dubost Vineyard & Winery in Paso Robles and was former superintendent for the San Miguel School District.

Scott is a surgeon in Salt Lake City who has received numerous



awards including "Utah Doctor of the Year". He is a graduate of Stanford University. While he is very accomplished professionally, he remains very involved with Rotary domestically & internationally. He was very animated in describing his many trips to India, first in active participation with polio clinics. It was a great thrill to visit impoverished villages where children treat you like a rock star. Scott observed that he would have never gotten involved

with trips to India without Rotary, stating "I am a selfish person and a selfless person. Rotary makes it easy to be selfless". The polio eradication trips to India led to other Global Grant projects such as providing new toilet blocks that enable young girls to remain in school once they reach puberty. Another international project modeled on a widely practiced domestic initiative was the distribution of dictionaries. But in India, the dictionary distribution is a bit more profound as it might be the only book many households own.

Scott was very grateful to get to participate in the International Assembly that brings together all 529 governor-elect representatives from districts around the world. The first area of focus is peace and Scott believes this is more likely to come from organizations like Rotary than political leaders. Scott ended his presentation by turning to the title of his speech, "Marginal Gains & Rotary". He cited the book *Black Box Thinking* by Mathew Syed for the term "marginal gains" to describe the process of breaking monumental projects into small manageable parts. When repeated and summed, they provide a huge impact. Rotary International provides the means to leverage marginal gains.
