Dick McKinley, Director Paso Robles Department of Public Works

As the name implies, the Department of Public Works keeps all Paso Robles city facilities working to serve the public. As Director of Public Works, Dick McKinley oversees the development, operation and maintenance of streets, public transportation, parks, sewers, and trash disposal with a staff of 56 employees and a budget of over \$32 M. One less obvious responsibility for the department is compliance with federal & state stormwater regulations mandated by the 1972 Clean Water Act and the State Water Resources Control Board. As McKinley notes, these regulations are an unfunded mandate, so a big part of the challenge is making compliance affordable to smaller cities like Paso Robles.

Dick McKinley (*right*) has been involved in public works activities since 1982. He was appointed to his current position in April 2015 having previously worked in a similar role in Surprise, AZ, and numerous localities in WA State. Dick was born in Michigan and holds a BA in economics from Michigan State University and an MPA from Portland State University. He and his wife reside in Paso Robles. They have 4 children and 4 grandchildren.



Paso Robles participates in the Phase II
Municipal Storm Water Program mandated by the State Water Resources
Control Board. The program requires the development & implementation
of a Storm Water Management Plan (SWMP) to reduce or eliminate
pollutants in stormwater runoff and non-storm water discharges. The plan
allows some flexibility in meeting its requirements so Paso Robles utilizes
rain gardens and bio-swales rather than more expensive treatment plants
or underground vaults. One more recent example is the 12th Street
"Green Street" project, a \$2 M street improvement project running from
Spring to Fresno Street that has a planted stormwater retention area
between the street and sidewalk. The Public Works Department works
hard to ensure that these designs meet all mandates while being attractive
and increasing local property values.
