Highlights from Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, GA

The Paso Robles Rotary Club was well represented this year at the Rotary International (RI) Convention in Atlanta. Our attendees provided a snapshot of activities and lasting impressions they experienced during the convention. A common theme expressed by our attendees was the awesome depth and breadth of the event with over 40,000 participants representing over 200 countries. This was the largest crowd ever except for the convention in Seoul, South Korea. Brenda Cressey (*left*) was inducted as an RI trustee, quite an honor for her and our club. Brenda noted one of the convention's most impressive achievements, collecting \$1.5 B in pledges toward the global initiative to eradicate polio. This was powered by



Bill Gates who attended the event and challenged attendees to collectively match his \$450 M contribution. They did so by a 2 to 1 margin. Ralph Byrd (*right*) was impressed by the LED bracelets given to the crowd by Gates that were lit red symbolizing polio cases in every country before the start of the campaign many years ago. The lights all turned green except one showing the 99.99% success rate of the campaign in a strikingly visual way.



Paula Byrd (*left*) talked about the many speakers who made an impression such as Amina Mohammed, Deputy Secretary-General for the United Nations. Ms. Mohamed talked about the importance of making international projects scalable-such as drip irrigation. Many projects go through phases where they are good, bad, transformed and good again. Rotary does change the world, one life at a time.
