Recreation Services is managed by Lynda Plescia (middle left). She oversees Community Events, Aquatics, Contract Classes, and Fields. Lynda came to the City in 2003 and was very involved in the refurbishment of Centennial Pool. In addition to a robust aquatics program, Lynda is responsible for the Concerts in the Park series that runs from June 1 - August 17 this year. Lynda is also working with Julie on their strategic plan.
