Jonathan Stornetta Paso Robles Fire Chief

Jonathan Stornetta was appointed to the permanent fire chief position for the city of Paso Robles on April 3. This position has far more responsibilities than just fire suppression activities. Jonathan leads the Paso Robles Emergency Services department that also manages emergency medical services, rescue, hazardous materials and other emergency responses. These are critical life saving services that Jonathan has trained and performed for over 25 years. Given his experience, it was not surprising that Jonathan was selected to serve as interim fire chief last October with a permanent appointment last month.

Jonathan was grew up in Atascadero and his family has raised beef



and dairy cattle locally for over 90 years. After graduating from high school, Jonathan became a reserve firefighter which led to an opportunity to attend paramedic school at UC Davis. He found his calling, serving 21 years as a paramedic and as a full time firefighter in Morro Bay. He moved to Paso Robles in 2001 and was progressively promoted to captain, interim battalion chief, and battalion chief

prior to his recent appointment. Jonathan now lives in Creston with his wife Lindsay and his 2 children.

Jonathan focused his presentation on the river rescue operations after heavy rains this past March. Firefighters quickly responded to a call reporting a person in distress on the Salinas River just north of the Niblick Bridge. They found a man and his dog clinging to a tree. They were able to throw him a flotation device until they could swim across the river to rescue him. At the same time, additional calls came in for other people at risk in the river. Using CHP Helicopter 70, fire rescuers completed 6 hoist rescues and rescue swimmers performed 4 additional rescues. These rescues involved people & assets from the cities of Paso Robles, Atascadero, San Miguel, Templeton, Cambria and SLO as well as Cal Fire and the CHP, demonstrating the close cooperation of these public safety organizations and their value to our community.
