Founder & Executive Director, In Our Backyard

Nita Belles provided an informative presentation on human trafficking (HT) in America and what we can do to stop it at our Oct 4 meeting. Nita was blunt in her characterization that HT is slavery. The price of a "slave" today is only \$100 versus \$40,000



in 1850. HT is the second largest and fastest growing crime in the world with over 250,000 US citizens trafficked here and abroad. Victims are hidden in plain sight & traffickers rely on silence to remain in business. Teens and runaways are particularly vulnerable with 1 in 3 of the 1.8-2.6 million runaways lured by traffickers within 48 hours of leaving home.

Nita encouraged everyone to speak up if they suspect someone is being influenced or held against their will by traffickers.
