Ty Lewis Commander and Incoming Paso Robles Police Chief

At our April 19 meeting, Commander Ty Lewis provided club members with a preview of his priorities when he becomes the police chief on July 15. While an extensive candidate search was conducted to

find the replacement for current chief Rob Burton, it was clear they found the most qualified candidate right in their own department according to City Manager Tom Frutchey. Ty has been in charge of every organization within the Paso Robles Police Department gaining insights into the people and processes as well as the strengths and challenges facing their organization. His goal is to lead the safest and most trusted police department anywhere.

Ty noted that officers often come under fire during performance of their duties from people in the community. So trust is vital and he added "you will always get transparency from me". Recent benchmarking exercises indicate that the department has excellent people, a stable budget, as well as strong community and regional support. Their primary challenges come from loss of experienced officers through retirement, a shrinking applicant pool, gang activity, recreational cannabis, and adequate emergency preparedness. Ty will implement a strategic plan that focuses on staff development and succession planning, recruitment, department-wide training, technology upgrades and enhancements, wider community engagement via social media, procedural justice training, and active shooter response training to improve emergency preparedness.
