Nate Maas

Principal of Alternative Education, Paso Robles

Continuation high school isn't what it used to be and that is a good thing in the Paso Robles Joint Unified School District (PRJUSD). Alternative education principal Nate Maas is leading Liberty Continuation High School, Independence High School, Paso Robles Independent Study Center (K-8 Home School) and the Paso Robles Online (PRO) Academy to provide quality educational opportunities for a variety of students who do not attend the traditional schools. Principal Maas believes these programs "are like a net catching as many students as possible".



Nate Maas was born in Guam and moved to SLO in 1976. He has an undergraduate degree from Moody Bible Institute, a masters degree from Cal Poly and is finishing a doctorate degree through UCSB. He served as a teacher and vice principal in the PRJUSD for 16 years prior to becoming a principal in August 2015. He is very proud of his family: his spouse Kristine and three sons Jonathan, Andrew, & Tim.

One of the interesting revelations about Liberty Continuation High School is that it is for all students 16 and older who are behind on credits - not just students with problems or issues. The school currently has about 130 students with smaller class sizes averaging 23 students. It has a very friendly feel and ranks second in academics within the local 5 county area. It even has an after school program and students are active in volunteer initiatives.

Independence High School is a fully-accredited independent study high school with 130 students. The non-traditional scheduling allows self motivated students who cannot come to school regularly achieve their educational goals while supporting work and home obligations. Another independent study program is the PRO Academy that currently supports 17 students with an all on-line curriculum. For younger students, the K-8 Home School program provides professional oversight to students and parents who prefer a homes school environment.

Nate noted that all of these alternative programs are populated by students that are voluntary placements-the students want to be there!
