Dr. Wen Chen Human Rights Activist

Dr. Wen Chen became a human rights activist after she she realized she had been "brainwashed" during her youth in China. According to Dr. Chen, it took five years to "awake" from brainwashing after she came to the U.S. to study at Cal Tech. She now spends much of her spare time doing community service by talking about her experiences and exposing what she believes is a common and growing form of human trafficking, organ harvesting.



Dr. Chen was born and raised in China. She attended the University of Science & Technology in Hefei, the capital of Anhui Province, from 1990 to 1994. After graduating with her degree in biology, she moved to Pasadena to attend graduate school at Cal Tech. After receiving her PhD in Genetics & Behavior Biology, she became the curator and bioinformatician for WormBase, the official database for nematode genome and biological studies. She is a member of Amnesty International.

Much of Dr. Chen's presentation was centered on the practice of organ harvesting of Falun Gong practitioners. Falun Gong is a Chinese qigong discipline involving meditation and a moral philosophy rooted in Buddhist tradition. The practice became popular in the 1990s in China, and by 1998, Chinese government sources estimated there were as many as 70 million followers. Perceiving that Falun Gong was a potential threat to the Party's authority and ideology, Communist Party leadership initiated a nationwide campaign in 1999 to eradicate the group. Over a half a million Falun Gong members were arrested and imprisoned. While the Chinese Government denies that it oversees the harvesting of organs from Falun Gong prisoners, Dr. Chin compared the practice of organ transplants in the U.S. where recipients typically wait 2-3 years for an organ to become available whereas it is only 1-4 weeks in China. Dr. Chen noted that much of this practice was documented in a film entitled "Human Harvest" that won a Peabody Award in 2015.
