Angelica Fortin Paso Robles Librarian

It's not hard to see why Angelica Fortin was chosen as one of the "Top Twenty Under Forty" awards bestowed annually by the *Tribune*. She is making a big difference as our city librarian, a position she took in April 2016. Since arriving, Angelica has worked to improve the quality and access of our library resources and programs to residents and other visitors. She is now focused on the executing the major facility improvements outlined in the City's new Library Facilities Master Plan. This 5-year strategic plan was requested by the City Council last year and has been refined through the use of focus groups. It was approved by the library Board of Trustees in January of this year and adopted by the City Council last month. Our club is one of the first groups to see the plan.



Angelica said she was "in awe" of the opportunity to run the Paso Robles library that was originally built as a Carnegie Library in 1908. The library was moved across Spring Street in 1985 and co-exists with City Hall. Being co-located with City Hall has created some challenges over the years including insufficient public & work spaces, overflowing shelves of books and no teen area. City officials looked at three options including the library taking over the second floor space occupied by City

Hall, renovating the first and second floors, or adding a new branch library in a different location. The second option was selected as the most cost effective solution. The renovation will add almost 4,000 sq.ft. of library space. The children's patio will be enclosed tripling "story time" space so popular for children. There is also room for a new "Teen Zone" that includes a teen study room as well as 3 more study rooms, a new multi-purpose room and 30% more group study space. There will also be a new quiet space and reference room upstairs next to City Hall. City Councilman Steve Gregory noted that the City has over \$2 million in the renovation account toward the \$4 million total renovation cost. He estimates that not moving City Hall to another locale saved \$14 million.
