Mayor Steve Martin provided club attendees with an update on the City of Paso Robles - reviewing where we have been, where we are today and where we are going. Steve has a broad perspective on Paso Robles having served as mayor since Dec 2014 and as a City Council member from 1987 to 1996. He was also selected by his council peers to be



mayor from 1988 to 1990. Steve noted that a recent survey of residents showed that 92% rate Paso Robles as a good or excellent place to live.

Steve's success can be attributed in part to his career experience in the field of communications. In addition to his duties as mayor, Steve owns and operates S.W. Martin & Associates, a marketing & advertising firm. His interest in communications began at Fresno State where he received a degree in journalism and broadcasting in 1973. He worked in a variety of positions from operations director at KPRL, editor of *Paso Robles Country News*, marketing director at Twin Cities Hospital, and executive director of Atascadero Main Street Association. Steve and his wife Jennifer have lived in Paso Robles for over 40 years and have been active participants in community affairs while raising two daughters.

Steve began his presentation by praising the city staff that he views as the "best ever". Their collective focus is on economic development, housing, transportation & infrastructure, and public safety. He laid out 3 "Man on the Moon" type objectives: Paso Robles will be the economic development center for the county, a model of modern transportation & infrastructure, and the safest place to do business in the county. Steve is working with the local Chamber of Commerce to hire an Economic Development Director. He is also very involved in the new Housing Constraints & Opportunities Committee aimed at increasing affordable housing. Other diverse initiatives include recycled water utilization, addressing unfunded pension liabilities, improving mental health & homeless services, animal shelter facilities, and mitigating opioid abuse. Mayor Martin is leading a great team to make Paso Robles even better!
