Sheriff Ian Parkinson - Postponed

While club members were disappointed at the cancellation of our guest speaker, Sheriff Ian Parkinson, it was not all that surprising given he was re-elected just two days prior, after a long, bruising campaign.

The cancellation provided an opportunity for members to update those attending on a variety of topics. Finance & Investment Committee members Larry Ward and Steve McAbee shared that the F&I Committee will be changing the way they manage club funds going forward. The recent transfer of trust funds has resulted in our fund now exceeding \$1.4 M. Rather than the past practice of investing in individual stocks selected by our committee, we will be hiring Stifel to vet six new money managers who will oversee separate portfolios focused on large capgrowth, large cap-value, small cap-growth, and international equities. The managers will split the overall portfolio with 80% equities and 20% cash. The committee believes the new arrangement will allow more time and expertise to be dedicated to our fund management. It will also shift liability to the external portfolio managers rather than club members who have been skillfully providing their expertise on a volunteer basis. Larry and Steve also provided their views on why managed funds may be preferable to index funds that have lower fees. Lastly, Larry and Steve announced that I&F Committee Chair Randy Kohn will be stepping down and they will be seeking a new club member to join the committee. They expressed gratitude for the outstanding job that Randy has done leading the committee and managing our funds responsibly while providing excellent returns.
