Lindsey Leonard, Executive Director Teddy Bear Cancer Foundation

Lindsey Leonard has worked for many non-profits over the years but is particularly passionate about the Teddy Bear Cancer Foundation (TBCF) she now leads. Their mission is to "empower families living in Santa Barbara, Ventura and San Luis Obispo counties that have a child with cancer by providing financial, educational, and emotional support." Their vision is to "be the lead agency to instill resilience in families experiencing pediatric cancer."



The TBGF was founded 16 years ago in 2002 by Nikki Katz. During this time they have awarded \$1.7 M in financial assistance to 1,808 people across the tri-county region. These awards help families of children with cancer to spend more time with their child by paying travel and accommodation expenses during treatment and other essential expenses incurred during time away from work such as rent or mortgage payments and, in the most unfortunate of

circumstances, funeral expenses. Last year, they provided financial support to 188 families, an all-time high.

Lindsey pointed out that TBCF is not limited to just providing financial support, but also provides critical emotional support and education programs that are also important to families. Emotional support includes counseling for the sick child, their parents, and siblings as well as activities such as sports outings and holiday parties that provide needed distractions from the grind of difficult cancer treatments. Educational programs include tutoring to help children who miss school and mental evaluations for children on chemotherapy.

Accompanying Lindsey to last Thursday's lunch were two members of the Gonzales family who support their family member, Madeline, who was diagnosed with cancer. Maddy's sister Jocelyn read a letter to attendees that exemplifies the attributes of the TBCF program in providing moral support and encouragement to cancer patients through their families. Jocelyn received a "Little Hero Award" by the TBCF recognizing her exemplary efforts to support her sister.
