Leon Tackitt, Ambassador Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Wounded Warriors

Leon Tackitt has a very successful second career as founder and operator of Tackitt Family Vineyards after 28 years serving in the Navy. But Leon has not forgotten his former colleagues who worked at the most dangerous job in the military, the Navy Explosive Ordinance Disposal (EOD) Unit. Leon works tirelessly in support of the EOD Wounded Warrior Foundation that serves the EOD community by

providing financial assistance and support to active-duty and veteran wounded, injured or ill EOD warriors, and families of wounded and fallen EOD warriors.

Leon presented some grim facts about the dangerous work of the EOD organization that serves all four branches of the military. At least 133 of their members were killed in Iraq and Afghanistan, 250 EOD technicians received severe injuries with over 2,500 of their members receiving Purple Hearts. Not surprisingly, many

soldiers performing this dangerous work suffer not only from the physical effects of explosions or other combat injuries, but many also suffer the mental effects of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) that makes life so difficult for returning combat veterans.

In addition to the EOD Wounded Warrior Foundation, Leon works with the Quality of Life Plus (QL+) organization founded by Jon Monett. They are working in partnership with Cal Poly engineers to employ new technology to improve the quality of life of returning combat veterans. Their current project is restoring a Toyota FJ60 that will be raffled off live during the final episode of the YouTube series "Blaster's Garage", on Dec. 21, 2018. There are only 5,000 raffle tickets available, and each ticket costs \$100. All proceeds from ticket sales will be donated to EOD Warrior Foundation and QL+. Leon urged club members to support this worthy cause.
