Deepa Willingham Founder of PACE Universal & Past District Governor

Deepa Willingham joined Rotary in 2001 and called it "one of the best moves I ever made in my life". Deepa is a past 5240 District Governor and she was introduced by her close friend, current District Governor John Weiss. Deepa is a true humanitarian and passionate about the issue of human trafficking. She noted "When I turned 60, it bothered me that I hadn't done anything to help others". So in 2003, she founded the nonprofit organization PACE Universal (Promise of Assurance for Children Everywhere) to stop trafficking and gender biased abuses of children and women. For her efforts, she has been recognized at the White House, was the keynote speakers at Rotary International's 100th year Convention in Birmingham, England and has addressed the United Nations on Rotary-UN Day twice.

Deepa is a longtime resident of Solvang and a native of India. She grew up in Piyali Junction, a poor village located 45 km from Kolkata (Calcutta), India, a major hub for the trafficking of girls. Her work at PACE began with the construction of what is now the PACE Learning Center (PLC) in her home town. She also formed a strategic partnership with the Rotary Club of Calcutta Metropolitan.

Deepa's presentation was full of sobering statistics on the issue of global poverty and how it enables traffickers to exploit the poor, especially women and children. There are 7.5 billion people in the world and 22% earn less than \$1.25 per day. One in five are illiterate and two thirds are women. Deepa asserts that "poverty is the parent of revolution and crime" and addressing poverty will help undermine terrorism and trafficking. Child trafficking captures over 2 million new victims each year and it grows because it is a "renewable commodity". Many are brought to the U.S. where there are 300,000 domestic children at risk of sex exploitation. One of the most shocking facts is the Super Bowl is the single biggest trafficking event annually. Deepa is currently raising funds for PACE and details of their local "Bollywood" event is on page 2.
